**Acquisitions to be rebranded as TBB Global Logistics**  
***Offices to be consolidated in Baltimore and Employ 24***

New Freedom, PA – Amco Brokers and Forwarders of Baltimore and Olimpex International, Inc., based at BWI, will soon be rebranded under TBB Global Logistics, Inc.'s International Division (TBBGL) banner. Recently acquired by TBBGL, these customs brokerage firms enhance TBBGL's international capabilities.

In July 2003, TBBGL acquired Amco Brokers and Forwarders of Baltimore, which serves the customs clearance needs of domestic and international customers from its headquarters at Dundalk Marine Terminal.

In October 2004, TBBGL acquired Olimpex International, Inc., a customs broker, air and ocean freight forwarder and a global trade consultant, based at BWI Airport in Maryland.

TBBGL's International Division provides service as an ocean freight forwarder, a non-vessel operating common carrier (NVOCC) and as a customs broker. The division is located at corporate headquarters in Southern Pennsylvania.

In March 2005, the three operations will be consolidated at BWI Airport in Maryland at 780 Elkridge Landing Road. Once the consolidation is completed, the Amco and Olimpex names will be retired and all services will be offered under the TBB Global Logistics name.

“We believe that having all international operations in one ‘super office’ gives us the capability to serve our clients more efficiently,” says Dennis Kelly, former Amco owner and current TBBGL vice president of international operations. “BWI was the ideal location because it provides quick access to U.S. Customs in Baltimore, as well as airport cargo services.”

No jobs will be eliminated due to the move. The new TBBGL International Services’ office will house 24 employees. TBBGL will continue to maintain a separate export consolidation service at nearby Canton Center Drive in Baltimore.

“We are excited that TBBGL now has the capability to coordinate the movement of goods to or from any point in the world at competitive prices, enabling the small and mid-sized client to compete more effectively,” stated company president Samuel Polakoff.

Ann Bruno, the former owner of Olimpex International and the current manager of International Business Development, continues, “We are able to offer a full array of international transportation management services. Our expanding network of international agents and the domestic capabilities of TBBGL makes the future very bright.”

After the new office is opened, TBBGL will launch the largest expansion of its proprietary TITAN computer system. “The new international module will coordinate a client’s purchase order from the time it is issued to the overseas vendor all the way through to customs clearance and final delivery to points in the U.S.,” says Polakoff. A web site combining all international capabilities will be unveiled later this year.

TBBGL was founded in 1946 and was one of the early pioneers of domestic third party transportation management. TBBGL began offering international transportation management services in the late 1980s. The new phone number for TBBGL’s International Division will be 877-654-6739.
